1.1 Guidelines for the Admission Process to be carried out by Unaided Colleges

1.0 Admission to CAP allottees for the institute

Admission authority in the institute shall follow the procedure mentioned under rule 6.4 for Reporting of candidates.

2.0 Eligibility criteria of candidates for admission process to be carried out at institute level for the vacant seats after CAP Rounds:

Seats available:

Vacancy within sanctioned intake due to the Non Reporting (AIEEE, MS seats in CAP), Non Allotment (AIEEE, MS seats in CAP) and Cancellations (if any).

- In Unaided Non Minority Colleges, the vacancies in backward class category seats within sanctioned intake shall be filled after removing the seat tag i.e. by treating these seats as GENERAL seats. The seats thus shall be filled after preparing a common merit list of all the candidates who have applied for the Vacancy round at the respective Unaided Non Minority Colleges.

The vacant seats shall be filled in the following order of preference.

a) Maharashtra State candidates (MHT CET-2009 basis)

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSE (Std.XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and secured minimum 50% marks i.e. 150 marks out of 300 marks (minimum 45% marks i.e. 135 marks out of 300 marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra state only) in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together.

AND

Obtained non zero score in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at MHT-CET 2009.

To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidates securing equal marks in MHT-CET 2009, the procedure given in Rule 4.2 of “MHT-CET 2009 Application Form & Information Brochure” shall be adopted.

b) Maharashtra State candidates (XII the basis)

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSE (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Education or its equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and secured minimum 50% marks i.e. 150 marks out of 300 marks (minimum 45% marks i.e. 135 marks out of 300 marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra state only) in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together.

To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal aggregate marks in HSE (Std. XII) examination, following order of preference shall be adopted: Marks obtained in Mathematics at HSE, Marks obtained in Physics at HSC, Grand total of marks obtained at HSC, Marks obtained in Mathematics at SSC Total of marks obtained at SSC.

c) Maharashtra State Candidates passing Diploma in Engineering/Technology

courses:

Diploma holders who have passed the diploma course in Engineering/Technology with minimum of 50% marks and medium of instruction as English from the Polytechnics affiliated to MSBTE or its equivalent / AICTE approved autonomous Polytechnics situate in or outside the Maharashtra State.

- To resolves a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal aggregate marks in Final year of the Diploma exam, following order of preference shall be adopted: Marks obtained in Mathematics at SSC, Grand total of Marks obtained at SSC.

d) Outside Maharashtra State candidates (MHT CET-2009 basis):

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with subject English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics

and secured minimum 50% marks i.e. 150 marks out of 300 marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together.

AND

Obtained non zero score in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at MHT-CET 2009.

- To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal aggregate marks in HSC (Std. XII) examination, Marks obtained in Physics at HSC, Grand total of marks obtained at HSC. Marks obtained in Physics at HSC, Grand total of marks obtained at HSC, Marks obtained in Maharashtra at SSC, Grand Total of marks obtained at SSC.

e) Outside Maharashtra State candidates (XIIth basis):

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with subject English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and secured minimum 50% marks i.e. 150 marks out of 300 marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together.

- To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal aggregate marks in HSC (Std. XII) examination, Marks obtained in Physics at HSC, Grand total of marks obtained at HSC. Marks obtained in Physics at HSC, Grand total of marks obtained at HSC, Marks obtained in Maharashtra at SSC, Grand Total of marks obtained at SSC.

f) Maharashtra State Candidates passing Diploma in Engineering/Technology courses:

Diploma holders who have passed the diploma course in Engineering/Technology with minimum of 50% marks and medium of instruction as English from the AICTE approved autonomous Polytechnics situate in or outside the Maharashtra State.

- To resolves a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal aggregate marks in Final year of the Diploma exam, following order of preference shall be adopted: Marks obtained in Mathematics at SSC, Grand total of Marks obtained at SSC.

Guidelines for the admission:

- All admissions shall be done in fully fair and Transparent Manner & shall be Merit based.
- The Principals of the respective Un aided Engineering Colleges shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two newspapers. Vacancies are also to be displayed on the notice board of the Institute. Detailed schedule of the admission process is also to be displayed.
- Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Principal of the respective colleges for admissions. These admissions will be make in a transparent manner and strictly as per the merit of the candidates who have applied to the institute.

Guidelines for the admission process for Institute level seats:

- All admissions shall be done in fully fair and transparent Manner & shall be Merit based.
- The Principals of the respective Un aided Engineering Colleges shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two newspapers. Institutes are required to mention the name of newspaper in which available seats will be notified in their prospectus/brochure. Detailed schedule of the admission process is also to be displayed.
- Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Principal of the respective colleges for admissions. These admissions will be make in a transparent manner and strictly as per the merit of the candidates who have applied to the institute.
- Information brochure/prospectus of the Institute which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission for seats to be filled at the Institute Level. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institute's website.

General Notes:

1. The allotment list of CAP rounds will be available to the institute through their Institute Login. The Institute should update the information of the reported candidates, allotted under CAP on the same day on which the candidate is reporting to the institute.
2. The Principal of the institute has to update the branch wise list of admitted candidates on DTE website through their institute login clearly indication the stage of their admission like CAP, Maharashtra Candidate against vacancy, OMS candidate against vacancy, Institute Level seats, J&K Migrant seats etc.
3. Three copies of such lists are to be printed and to be submitted to the concerned Regional Office of Technical Education, duly signed by the Principal / Head of the Institute.
4. It is binding on all the Universities to grant enrollment only for the students on approved list.

Important: All the Engineering Degree Colleges are required to complete their admission process on or before the cut off date as specified in the schedule.

2.6.2 Types of seat under CAP:-

Maharashtra State Seats:

- **Home University Seats (HU Seats):** Certain percentage of seats of every institute is reserved for Home University i.e. for the University under the jurisdiction of which that institute is situated. Home University seats are available for allotment through CAP for the Maharashtra candidates having their Home University status as that University. For example, candidates having their Home University as Pune University will be eligible for Home University seats of those institutes which are located in the jurisdiction of Pune University.

- **Seats for candidates belonging to Universities other than Home University (OHU seats):**

Certain percentage of seats of every institute is reserved for other Universities other than Home Universities under the jurisdiction of which that institute is located. Such as seats are called as OHU seats. Candidate can opt for seats of any other University (excluding his/her Home University) under this provision of OHU seats. For example, candidates having their home university as SEB Amravati University will not be eligible for the OHU seats of those institute which are located in SGB Amaravati University. Candidates having their home University other than SGB Amaravati University are eligible for these OHU seats of the SGB Amaravati University.

Note : statutory reservations for candidates of **backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State only** will be as per relevant rules and resolutions of the Government Of Maharashtra will be applicable for admissions against the seats available in Home University and Other than Home University. This provision of reservation is not available in Unaided Minority Institutes.

All India (AIEEE 2009 Paper 1) Seats:

These seats are available for allotment through CAP for AIEEE 2009 (Paper-1) qualified candidates. No reservation for backward class categories is provided in these seats i.e. these seats are treated as belonging to the "General Category".

2.6.3 Admissions to VJIT Mumbai; COE, Pune; UICT, Mumbai, SGGSI&T, Nanded and WCE, Sangli:

As per Government Resolution(s), admissions to these institutes will be carried out separately. These institutes will not be considered under Centralized Admission Process. Common Entrance Test for the admissions to these institutes will remain same as that of MHT-CET –2009 conducted for Engineering, Pharmacy & Medical Degree courses by the competent Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra. Candidates are required to fill up separate applications form for admissions to these institutes. Admissions for the seats of these institutes will be carried on the basis of MHT-CET-2009 marks as per the inter se merit of the candidates of the State of Maharashtra who have applied separately for admissions to these Institutes as per the relevant rules. Statutory reservations for candidates belonging to backward class categories as per the relevant rules and resolution of the Government of Maharashtra will be applicable for admissions to these institutions.

2.6.4 Sanctioned intake for various Courses in various Institutes for the year 2009-10:

- Sanctioned intake for Various Courses in various Institutes for the year 2009-10 is mentioned in the Institute information part of this brochure .
- The AICTE shall communicate to the State Government the approved new institute /s , s the changes in the intake capacity of different courses and the new courses in the existing institutes, before 15th June 2009.
- Approvals to start a new institute / course and changes in the intake capacity of the existing courses communicated after the 15th June 2009 will not be considered for admission during the academic year 2009-10.
- Approvals to start a new institute and changes in the intake capacity for the course in existing institutes communicated by AICTE after the printing of the information brochure shall be displayed on the website <http://www.dte.org.in/fe2009> and will not be separately notified in and new newspaper but will be made available at all the Regional offices of the Technical Education .
- As per AICTE approval received on or before 15th June 2009, final sanctioned intake for all the courses of all the institutes coming under CAP Will be displayed on the website [http:// www. Det.org in/fe2009](http://www.Det.org.in/fe2009) will also be available at all Regional offices of the Technical Education . The final Information displayed on DTE Web site will be treated as authentic for admissions for the year 2007-08, Candidates are instructed to refer the web site for the revised and final Institute Information before filling the Preference form .Notification will also be issued by Director of Technical Education regarding the date of display of the Institute Information on DTE web site <http://www.dte.org.in/fe2009>.

3.0 Reservation :

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time .

3.1 Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates :

The percentage of seats reserved candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State is as per the details in table given below. The percentages of reservation are the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates, which are coming under the purview of the Competent Authority (Refer notes 1-5 given below for details). These are the minimum percentages of reservation exclusive of the backward class candidates securing allotment through General Merit by virtue of merit Backward class candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application from.

Note:

1. The reservation for backward class candidates shall not be available in Unaided Minority colleges.
2. The reservation for backward class candidates shall not be available in Unaided Non-Minority colleges and it will be 50% of MS CAP seats.
3. Reservation for backward class candidates i.e. 50% as stated above shall be available in Government, Government Aided Institutes, University Dept. and University Managed Institutes.
4. Candidates belonging to Special Backward Class (SBC) will be offered reservation up to 2% seats of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates which are coming under the purview of the Competent Authority subject to condition that any seats remain vacant in the reserved category at the end of stage-I of University level allotment. These seats are carved out during the allotment stage-I and no separate seats are earmarked before the start of the allotment process.
5. Even if the candidate belonging to Backward Class Category secures admission against a seat belonging to the General category by virtue of merit, such candidate has to produce all the necessary documents in support of the category

claimed both at the time of admission and while filling up of the CAP admission form.

6. All OMS candidates are treated as GENERAL/OPEN candidates and are not eligible to claim reservation for backward class category candidate.

3.2 Reservation for sons/daughters of defence service personnel:

Five (5) per cent seats of the total sanctioned intake for an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for

- Children of ex-service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (Def-1).
- Children of active service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (Def-2).
- Children of active service personnel (Def-3)
 - Who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State.
 - Who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

These seats are within the sanctioned intake capacity and are available as **State Level seats**. A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 & DEF3 candidates shall be prepared. **Admission against the Defence category seats will be made strictly on the basis of inter se merit of combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 & DEF3 candidates.**

Refer Pro forma C, D & E for claiming this provision.

Note:

This provision is **NOT available to the children of CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working / who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

3.3 Reservation for Physically Handicapped Candidates:

As per the provisions in Clause 39 of Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation Act 1995, three (3) per cent seats of total sanctioned intake capacity of all the institutions coming under CAP shall be reserved for physically candidates, (P2)

- Visually impaired (blind) candidates (P1)
- Speech & hearing impaired (deaf & dumb) candidates, (P2)
- Orthopedic disorders, learning disabilities, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dysgraphica, Spastic (P3)

Refer Proforma – F/F-1 for claiming this provision

Allotment of the seats reserved for the Physically Handicapped candidates shall be done on the basis of single combined merit list of such candidates. These seats are available in 70% Home University area seats only.

Note: It should be noted that the physically Handicapped candidates on admission to Engineering / Technology degree course will not be given any exemptions or additional facilities in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective Universities.

3.4 Reservation for Female candidates:

As per the provisions in Govt. Resolution No. GEC-1000/ (123/2000)/ Tech. Edu.-1, dated 17th April, 2000, 30% seats available for CAP shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses of the institutions coming under CAP. This reservation shall be applicable for General, SC, St, DT/VJ (NT-A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D and OBC categories. Seats reserved for Female candidates are available under both the 70% Home University seats and 30% Other than **Home University seats coming under the CAP**. There shall be no reservation for Female candidates under Defense, Physically Handicapped and SBC categories.
